Symbiosis

Symbiosis



It is any close and long-term biological interaction between two organisms of different species.

The term is sometimes more exclusively used in a restricted, mutualistic sense, where both symbionts contribute to each other's subsistence. This means they benefit each other in some way.

The First Outcome

"Much fruit."

Symbiosis



Competition – reduces both parties' fitness

Amensalism – one party's fitness is reduced

Commensalism – one benefits, but the other is largely unaffected

Parasitism – one benefits at the other's expense

Mutualistic – both parties benefit
