


## John 4:1-4






## John 4:6-10



<sup>8</sup>He was alone at the time because his disciples had gone into the village to buy some food.




## John 4:6-10

<sup>10</sup> Jesus replied, “If you only knew the gift God has for you and who you are speaking to, you would ask me, and I would give you living water.”



Each time he said, “My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness.” So now I am glad to boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ can work through me.




## John 4:31-34



You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. Why are you asking me for a drink?






## 2 Corinthians 12:10

That's why I take pleasure in my weaknesses, and in the insults, hardships, persecutions, and troubles that I suffer for Christ. For when I am weak, then I am strong.




