**Although the term appears only once in the Hebrew canon, יְהָב (yehāb) conveys the idea of a personal load—anything that weighs on the heart, body, or mind—which can be transferred to another party better equipped to carry it.**

**sustain**

**Hebrew = kul**

**Pronunciation: kool**

**Definition: provided, endure, contain, hold,  
provide, sustain, holding**

**1. Hagar was controlled by a controlling woman:  
Sarai.**

- The Burning Bush (Exodus 3:2–6) The angel of the Lord appeared to Moses**
- Hagar (Genesis 16:7–13) calls Him “the God who sees me” El Roi**
- Abraham (Genesis 22:11–18) stopped from sacrificing his son, Isaac**
- Jacob (Genesis 32:24–30 wrestles with God**
- Manoah & wife (Judges 13:3–22) Samson’s parents**

**The Bible Hub defines “the Angel of the LORD” is “a distinctive figure (that) appears repeatedly, identified both with God and yet distinct from Him. The Angel speaks with divine authority, receives worship, forgives sins, and bears the covenant name. These theophanies foreshadow the incarnation of the Son, who perfectly reveals the Father.”**

**God revealed Himself to Hagar--  
not once, but twice!**

**Hagar--an Egyptian, a slave and a woman.**

**Hagar is the only person in the Bible to actually give God a name. She named Him "El Roi" the God who sees.**

**Ismael means  
"the God who hears"**

**2. In order for Hagar to receive the promise given to her, she had to go back to Abram's house and be SUBMISSIVE to Sarai.**

# **Genesis 21:8-21**
